



- **92%** of all donations went directly to services!
 - **418** weekend food sacks for elementary children
 - **60** kits including PPE given to the homeless
 - **1755** meals for orphans in India
 - **40** children sponsored with school supplies and blankets in Bangladesh




Local Missions – Food Insecurity




Weekend Food Sacks

Providing Elementary Children with Food to Eat



The Near East Side of Columbus is in the **top 7 percentile of poor neighborhoods** in the nation.

This community lies in a **food desert** without easy access to healthy food for families.



To help these families this school year we packed **Weekend Food Sacks** for elementary children.

During late month Fridays we distributed sacks full of **healthy calories** to supplement families budgets.



These food sacks **prevented hunger** over the weekend allowing parents to care for their families and kids to focus on their school work.

Over **400 food sacks** were distributed providing over **3 million healthy calories!**

Local Missions – Homelessness




Homeless Camp Visits

Summer Relief for the Homeless



Each year we join in with Maryhaven Columbus on their homeless camp outreach around the city.

During these visits **we get to know them**, their names, families, where they're from, and even some of their story.



During the August camp visit, we gave away 60 sets of PPE, bottled water and new undergarments.

They were grateful for the help and care. One lady, after receiving a fresh set of supplies said, "**I need to be free from drugs**".



We took time to pray with her and afterward she said, "I want to sign up for housing." This meant **she would start the process of getting clean!**

Through the process of meeting her physical and spiritual needs we saw **God touch her heart!**

Food for Hope Home Orphanage in India
